| PE           | <i>Students will practise their fundamental movement skills. They will also have the opportunity to access rebound and hydrotherapy.</i>  |
| DT           | <i>Students will be investigating materials and their properties and qualities. They will produce a creative wall display made up the differing materials they investigate.</i> |
| MFL - French | <i>Students will be exploring different types of French music as well as the French food which can be in a typical town.</i>  |
| Music        | <i>Students will be exploring songs and begin to identify how they can create a range of sounds using different parts of their body.</i>  |
