Dear Parents/ Carers

Following my letter at the beginning of this week, we now have some more details we are able to share with you regarding school opening up to our wider cohort of students.

As the government have now announced that schools can open fully, unless a statutory reason applies, all students of compulsory school age are expected to attend school from the week commencing 8th March 2021, except those who are clinically extremely vulnerable. With this in mind, please see the below key dates for students return.

Key dates for students returning week commencing 8th March 2021

- Full-time return on Monday 8th March for all Year 11, 12, 13 and 14 students
- Full-time return on Tuesday 9th March for all Year 9 and 10 students
- Full-time return on Wednesday 10th March for all Year 7 and 8 students

If your child has already been attending school, they will continue to attend on a fulltime basis from Monday 8th March 2021. For those students who will continue to shield, or for those students returning on the 9th or 10th March, remote education will continue to be provided and your child's class teacher will be in touch. Transport will also be organised upon your behalf.

Where we have had consent from parents to accompany their child for lateral flow testing, we are currently organising the schedule and will update you week commencing 1st March 2021. The government guidance for our setting is also getting updated tomorrow so we will also update you as to what further action will need to be taken.

While the government continues to ask that we stick to current guidance, we kindly ask that all of our school community carry on adhering to keep us all as safe as possible. This includes keeping to the 2 metre social distance, wearing a face covering when required and not being the link in the chain.

The guidance for wearing face coverings on transport has not changed and for those that are able to, we kindly ask they continue to wear them and that parents supply a plastic bag for them to be stored in after removing them before entering school. School will continue to follow our current face covering procedures, so students are not required to wear them within the school day, but if there are any changes we will update you accordingly.

We are looking forward to seeing all of the students back safe and well.
