Dear Parents/Carers,

As part of the St Hugh's Careers Programme your child's Year 11 careers guidance interview has been arranged for April/May. A careers guidance interview is an impartial one-to-one meeting with a professionally qualified careers adviser. The careers adviser for St. Hugh's School this year is Ruth Henderson from the Local Authority. During the meeting Ruth will help your child explore their interests, how they are getting on in school, likes and dislikes, family influences, barriers, work experience and any careers ideas they may already have. There will be an opportunity for your child to ask questions, and resources will be provided to help generate ideas if your child is still unsure.

The careers guidance interview is an important part of our careers programme. It can increase your child's awareness of their options upon leaving St. Hugh's, enhance their decision making skills and can maximise their potential to achieve their personal goals. A careers action plan will be drawn up to help your child move towards a decision and make the appropriate next steps for them.

In preparation for their careers interview we encourage you to have discussions with your child about their skills, personal qualities and preferences. Talking about their careers ideas and plans can also help to focus their thinking before their meeting.
