

Report for 2017/2018 Academic Year

Year 7 Catch-up Grant Summary

The year 7 literacy and numeracy catch up premium grant includes all year 7 pupils who did not achieve at least a level 4 in reading and/or mathematics at key stage 2 based on end of key stage 2 attainment.

The grant at St Hugh's is spent for the purposes of the school for the educational benefit of students:-

This includes:

- Individual tuition in addition to classroom teaching in the form of small group tuition
- Access to a broader range of supporting software for Maths and English in order to develop learning further through access of computer based learning
- Access to a range of therapy support to ensure student wellbeing is stabilised in order to fully access learning
- Access to specific communication package

Impact of programmes is now measured with an updated target setting rationale adopted by our school. This supports the setting of aspirational targets.

2017/2018 (2022 leavers)

The premium for this financial year (1st April 2017 to 30th March 2018) included 29 students (number based on January school census) and equated to £14,500 based on £500 per student.

2016/2017 (2021 leavers)

Assessment used supports the new curriculum which is fully embedded. Students were baselined in Autumn 16 and progress recorded for Spring and Summer 17.

The pupil premium for this financial year included 26 students and equated to £13,000 based on £500 per student.
